

Telling the Story

We sit.

SIRACH 24.1-9, 18-21

Reader: A reading from Sirach

Hear Wisdom sing her own praises; She proudly proclaims her glory among her own people. She speaks out in the assembly of YHWH, in the presence of the God's host: "I am the word come forth from the mouth of YHWH; I enveloped the earth like a mist. I dwelt in the high heavens, my judgment seat a cumulus cloud. Alone I encompassed the vault of the sky; I wandered across the abyss. Over the waves of the sea, over the whole earth, over all the peoples and nations I reigned. I searched for a place to rest among all these places, where I would dwell among all of creation. Then the Creator of all these things chose a place for my dwelling and commanded me, 'Dwell in the land of Jacob; make Israel your inheritance.' Before motion began to be measured, God created me, and my heritage will last forever."

"Come near, all you who yearn to eat heartily of my fruit; you will be reminded that I am sweeter than honey, more precious than the honeycomb. Once you feed on me, you'll yearn for more. Once you hear me out, you are beyond disgrace; once you follow my regimen, you'll fail no more."

WISDOM OF SOLOMON 10.13-17

Reader: A reading from the Wisdom of Solomon

It was She who refused to abandon one just person who was sold into slavery, preserving him from sin and accompanying him into prison. She did not abandon him in his chains and won for him the authority over a whole nation and command over all his oppressors. She turned the tables on those who had accused him falsely and gave him undying glory. And it was She who delivered a holy people, a blameless stock, from a nation of oppressors; She entered the soul of one of YHWH's faithful, who, with signs and wonders, was able to stand against an imposing ruler. She rewarded the labors of a holy people and guided them on a wondrous quest, becoming their shade by day and their starlight at night.

PSALM 143

O Bringer of Joy, awaken my heart; pour your love and blessings through all my being!

Free me from attachments and desire, that I may become a clear mirror, reflecting your love to the world.

For fear has pursued me,

it has crushed my spirit to the ground; it has veiled your light so that I dwell in darkness.

Therefore, I cry out to You, O Great Awakener; Help me to rise once again like the phoenix of old! I recall days gone by; I meditate on all that You have done. I muse on the Covenant of your love.

I open my heart to You; my soul thirsts for You like a parched land.

Strength comes with pureness of heart. Cleanse me anew, O Gentle Healer.

This yearning within my soul is naught but the inner birthright to know and live in You.

Let me hear your Voice within the Silence, for in You I put my trust.

Teach me ways of loving service, that I might co-operate with You, O my Beloved.

Help me to face my fears, O Divine Nurturer! I call on You for Healing!

Instruct me in your Divine Precepts, cultivate my soul!

1 CORINTHIANS 1.26-30

Reader: A reading from Paul's letter to the community at Corinth

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption.

The Passion: Companionship & Cross

Reader: The Passion of Jesus and Mary

Gathered with his friends, "the Blessed One said, Peace be with you! Bear my peace within yourselves! Beware that no one lead you astray saying, 'Look over here!' Or 'Look over there!' For the Child of Humanity is within you! Follow it! Those who seek it will find it."

~Mary 4.2-7

Jesus also said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." Later, he was arrested, tortured and hung on the cross by the Romans. Near the cross of Jesus were standing his mother and his mother's sister, as well as Mary the wife of Clopas and Mary of Magdala.

~John 14.1a, John 19.25-26a

Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last . . . And the women looking on from a distance included Mary Magdalene and Mary, the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome . . .

~Mark 15.37,40

Joseph of Arimathea took the body, wrapped it in a clean linen sheet, and laid it in his newly made tomb, which he had cut in the rock; and, before he left, he rolled a great stone against the entrance of the tomb. Mary of Magdala and the other Mary remained behind, sitting in front of the grave.

~Matthew 27.59-64

On the first day of the week, when it was still dark, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary brought spices to anoint Jesus. But the stone was gone and he was not there. An angel of the Lord said, "Do not be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus. He is not here. He has been raised from death, as he told you. Come and see! Go and tell the others."

Jesus himself appeared first to Mary Magdalene, but she did not recognize him.

- ~Rabboni!
